MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

While addressing elders at Ephesus as recorded in Acts 20:28, Paul exalted them to take care of themselves and the flock which the Holy Spirit had made them overseers. He further encouraged them to take care of the church which Christ obtained with his own blood. It is for this reason that I take this opportunity to thank all Elders in our church for the continued dedication and commitment to this noble calling. The Elders have been very instrumental in organising worship in the new normal and supporting the vulnerable people during this covid-19 pandemic.

It is therefore with a lot of gratitude to God that we are marking a century of eldership since September 1920 when first Elders of African origin were ordained. The ordination of African Elders meant that the gospel would spread faster and reach out to more people. This ordination was very key as it would see the Christian literature in Kikuyu develop and later the writing of the bible in Kikuyu language.

The office of an Elder is very key in our church. Firstly, they attend meetings and together with the minister make critical decisions on church matters. Secondly, they offer pastoral oversight to members of the church. Thirdly they stand in and conduct church services when the ministers are attending other congregations. They also act as example to be emulated by living out their lives in accordance with the scriptures besides encouraging other church members to do the same.

The number of Elders has grown in rips and bounds across East Africa. From the initial 43, we now have more than twenty thousand Elders. The contribution of the elders' service in the church has contributed to numerical growth and increase in membership of our church, from few hundreds to the excess of four million members today. Elders have also contributed to churches infrastructural growth, and have assisted in maintaining peace, harmony, and unity in the church over many decades.

Through the wisdom and unity of purpose of our ruling and teaching Elders, the church has also made monumental decisions that have shaped the entire society throughout history. Some of these decisions are: Saying no to female circumcision as early as 1928; and opposing oaths that went against Christian teachings. As we mark this milestone, I wish to congratulate the current Elders both active and retired and pray that the Almighty God will give them wisdom and grace as they continue to serve.

Finally, recognising that we are the fruit of the seeds that these first Elders have sown, we have adopted the theme, *Bearing Lasting Fruits* based on John 15:16. This theme not only reminds us of the efforts of the past Elders but also challenges to continue this legacy and leave lasting fruits for posterity.

May God bless our Elders. May God bless our church.

BACKGROUND TO THE CELEBRATIONS

On this occasion of 100 years anniversary of Africans' Eldership, we give thanks to almighty for the growth of the little seeds which have germinated and multiplied a hundred-fold as evidenced by various congregations throughout Central, Eastern and Rift Valley Provinces of Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania; as well as the worshipping communities in in USA and Britain. We celebrate the Presbyterian form of leadership identified with Elders. Elder in the Greek language is 'Presbyteros' from which we derive our 'presbyter' translated as 'elder.' Presbyterian church is governed by representative assemblies or courts of Elders. The 'Ruling' and the 'Teaching' Elder is the foundation in the Reformed Tradition of the Presbyterian Church.

In 2018, our church celebrated the one hundred and twentieth anniversary of the planting of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa in Kenya. Although the first pioneers of this great movement had arrived from Kibwezi in September, 1898 at Kikuyu, where the work of what was later to become the Church of Scotland Mission (CSM) was started, it was not until 1920 when the Presbyterian form of Church governance was established. The first Kirk Session was constituted on the 16th September 1920 and the ordination of the first 26 Elders took place on 19th September 1920 at Kikuyu, and on 26th September 17 Elders were ordained at Tumutumu. On 17 September 1920 the Presbytery of Kenya Colony was constituted by the Nairobi Kirk Session and the newly ordained elders from Kikuyu.

Let us therefore re-dedicate ourselves not only for the coming one hundred years and respond to the command of Jesus Christ to go to all corners of the world and continue bearing lasting fruits for our Master.
